HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS

The Southwell and District Agricultural Society have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective it is essential that all present take proper precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. Instructions of officially appointed officers and stewards must be obeyed at all times. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their animals under complete control. All animals are to be disease free. Everyone bringing moving machinery onto the showground must have adequate third party liability insurance. Tradestand holders, contractors and others must conform strictly to the health and safety regulations, which apply to them.

SHOW RULES

SOUTHWELL AND DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY is a Company Limited by Guarantee and shall make such rules for its Annual Ploughing Match and Show as its General Committee shall from time to time decide.

1. Ownership of animals - every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
2. Judges interest in entries - Exhibitors are particularly requested to note the name of the judge appointed for all classes which they wish to enter and are advised in the interests of all concerned not to knowingly enter an animal which has been owned or bred by the judge. Where the judge has a continuing business or financial relationship with an exhibitor, he/she should not judge an animal entered by that exhibitor whether or not the animal concerned forms part of that business relationship. Where the judge has had a past financial or breeding interest in an animal, he/she should not judge it. In such cases the Ring Steward in conjunction with the Chief Steward will make arrangements for the exhibit to be finally placed by another judge.
3. Substitution of Judges - the Committee reserve the right in their absolute discretion to change the identity of the judge for any classes from the one previously announced.
4. Any exhibit not on the Showground by the time stated in the Schedule is liable to disqualification.
5. Entries not accepted - the Society may in their absolute discretion refuse to accept any entry, the entry will be returned along with any fee and no correspondence will be entered into with regard to the non-acceptance.
6. Number of entries - any number of entries may be made, unless otherwise stated in the class schedule, in each class upon the payment of the appropriate fee.
7. Competitors may enter more than one entry per class. Where a cup is presented for the most points, an allocation system will be implemented. Should an individual receive more than one allocation of points per class, only the highest will be counted towards the trophy.
1st Prize - 3 Points, 2nd Prize - 2 Points, 3rd Prize - 1 Point.
8. Cancellation of Classes - In the event of there being insufficient entries the Society reserves the right, in its absolute discretion, to amalgamate or cancel classes. If the class is cancelled the entry fees will be returned. Exhibitors will be informed before the show if this is being done.
9. Withholding Prizes - a judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.
10. Exhibitors Risk and Responsibility - Neither the SOCIETY NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANY WAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or to any exhibit or to any vehicle carrying any exhibit or anything else brought into the Showground or for anything else arising out of the Society's Show. EACH EXHIBITOR shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss or injury or damage done to or commissioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him or her and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. It is, therefore, the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that they have adequate insurance cover in place.
11. Exhibitors are responsible for the safekeeping of trophies, whilst in their possession, and return of the trophies six weeks prior to the show.
12. Parade of Exhibits - All first, second, third and trophy winners in the various Livestock Sections) MUST parade in the Grand Parade. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of prize money.
13. Time for Delivery of Exhibits - unless the class schedule states otherwise, all exhibits must be on the showground by 8.30am on the show day or one hour before the stated judging time. In the case of unavoidable delay judges have discretion to permit admission. Any infringement of this rule may result in the disqualification of the exhibit.

14. Removal of Exhibits - livestock (other than light horses) may not be removed from the Showground until after the Grand Parade. Other exhibits may not be removed until 4.00pm on the day of the Show or in the case of on-going classes before the close of the day's events.
15. Any objection or dispute must be made in writing to the Secretary in the Secretary's Tent on the day of the Show, and a deposit of £10.00 made within one hour of the award being made. If in the opinion of the Committee the objection is considered to be frivolous the deposit shall be forfeited.
16. The Committee formed to hear any objection may at the discretion of the Chairman consist of himself and not less than 4 Stewards on the day of the Show. To be held at Secretary's marquee.
17. Health and Safety Regulations at Agricultural Shows - In accordance with Health and Safety Regulations all livestock exhibitors/stock attendants and all horse exhibitors and competitors must comply with the above.
18. All Animals must be restrained - by halter, tether, leash or other means except as required at the time of judging. In the Livestock Section every animal must have secure headgear at the time of judging and all animals must be double-tied to the cattle lines
19. Conduct of Exhibitors and their Servants - Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of their servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of any servants or agents.
20. The Judges Decision shall be final
21. Litter - It is the responsibility of Exhibitors to remove all litter (except animal bedding) accruing in their display area. Failure to do so will result in the cost incurred being recoverable from the Exhibitor.
22. Sale of Food and Drink - is strictly prohibited unless prior authorisation has been granted in writing by the General Secretary.
23. Data Protection - Exhibitors names and address will be published in show publications unless the Society is specifically instructed otherwise.
24. Refunds – Under no circumstances will Entry fees be refunded in the case of cancellation of entries by an Exhibitor
25. Cancellation Policy – The Society reserves the right to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Where such decision arises from directives, happenings or circumstances outside the control of the Society, the Society will refund fees, once any administration fees have been deducted. The Society will not be under any liability for loss or damage (whether direct or indirect, consequential or otherwise) arising from or caused by a cancellation, abandonment or curtailment

PLOUGHING CLASSES

INSURANCE

A minimum of third party insurance must be in place for every competing ploughman and entry into ploughing will be taken as an assumption that this is the case. Please be aware you may be asked to provide proof of this.

PRIZE WINNERS

The society requests all tractor and horse ploughmen to be present on the ploughing field for the presentation of results, cups and special prizes at 3.30pm. Prize money will be presented with the cups and special prizes. Any prize money not collected on the day of the show will be forfeited.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTRY FOR ALL PLOUGHMEN

ENTRIES CLOSE FRIDAY 6th SEPTEMBER 2024

To allow time for the marking out of plots and for the allocation of entries for Special Awards, the Secretary reserves the right to refuse late entries.

ALL PLOUGHMEN should state the following on their entry forms.

1. **Make** of tractor and plough in all classes.
2. **Year** of manufacture of plough and tractor – Classes 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 10 & 11.
3. **Number** of furrows of plough
4. **Age** if under 21 years for Class 18
5. All YFC members entering Class 19 must state their club and must be able to present their membership card to stewards on the day of the competition.
6. Class 8 'NOVICE' will be determined as not having previously won a first prize and will stand as declared at time of Entry.

SOUTHWELL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GENERAL RULES

APPLY TO ALL PLOUGHMEN

1. All ploughmen to plough as per catalogue number unless instructed otherwise by a ploughing steward.
2. In the event of any dispute the matter will be referred to the Objection Committee, (comprising of the ploughing stewards) and their decision will be final.
3. The objector shall deposit £10.00 with the stewards which will be forfeited to the society should the objection not be upheld.
3. Any competitor found to falsify the age of tractors and/or ploughs on their entry form will be disqualified.
4. Practising of opening splits or any other ploughing is not permitted and will result in disqualification. Opening splits should start at the headland mark and not before.
5. Handling treading or shaping of furrows by hand or hand held instrument is not permitted.
6. Assistance to set up and remove sighting poles (maximum 3) is allowed, no other assistance will be allowed except in an emergency, class steward to be informed. Novice competitors are allowed assistance from the headland only, except in an emergency.
7. All competitors to cast towards the next highest number.
8. The first and second run next to the neighbours plot will be allowed as straightening furrows and will not be judged. If there is a problem, the competitor must contact the head steward for a ruling before ploughing the first run next to their neighbour.

9. In conventional plough classes the last furrow must be turned towards own start.
10. No rolling of opening splits with tractor wheels allowed in any class.
11. All opening splits to be judged before ploughing proceeds.
12. All conventional ploughmen to make a double split opening.
13. Any questions arising and not provided for in these rules shall be decided by the stewards, whose decision shall be final and binding.
14. If there are less than five entries in any class, the reserve prize will not be presented.
In the event of any draw, in all ploughing classes, the count back method will be used to determine the placings.
15. **PLOUGHS**
 - (a) Tractor ploughs to be fitted with skimmers.
 - (b) Tailpieces are allowed.
 - (c) Plough bodies must be in a "ploughing" position at all times.
 - (d) All plough bodies must be used when finishing.
16. The use of GPS technology, laser beams, or any other electronic or computerised devices is not allowed.
17. A minimum of third party liability insurance must be held by every competing ploughman. Please be aware you may be asked to provide proof of this.

TIMETABLE

To allow for the processing of results within a tight schedule, the society would be grateful if competitors would make every effort to start and finish ploughing on time. **10 penalty points per minute may be deducted**, at the steward's discretion.

- (a) CLASSES 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12 - Ploughmen to assemble on the field at 8.30am. To start at 9.00am. To be finished at 1.30pm. Time inclusive of 30 minutes for judging of openings.
- (b) Horse Ploughing CLASSES 13 & 14 - Ploughmen to assemble at 9.00am to start ploughing at 9.30am. To be finished at 1.30pm. ready to parade in the main show ring at 2.00pm.
- (c) CAST OFF - 15 minutes extra time for any cast-off done after the ploughing has commenced.

SECTION RULES FOR TYPES OF PLOUGHING

CONVENTIONAL PLOUGHING

CLASSES: 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10.

See also - Introduction & instructions, general rules and timetable.

OPENING	Double Opening - no land shall be left returned.
START	Start to consist of 11 or 12 furrows. Cast towards next highest number.
FINISH	Finish to consist of last 8 furrows. Finish ploughed towards competitors' own start.
DEPTH	Class 1 - Minimum depth 20cm. Vintage Ploughing - Minimum depth 15cm. Ferguson - Minimum depth 15cm. Classic - Minimum depth 17cm.

REVERSIBLE PLOUGHING

CLASS: 2 The Society of Ploughmen rules will apply

CLASS: 3

See also - Introduction & instructions, general rules and timetable.

Reversible Ploughing with any Tractor and any make of Reversible Plough as manufactured and not adapted. No extra Hydraulic Rams.

OPENING START	Single furrow opening, turned towards the lower number using right hand bodies. Two or three furrow ploughs. Competitors to plough 8 or 9 furrows, turning the opening back under the first furrow. Four furrow ploughs and over to plough one full round, turning the opening back under the first furrow. All Competitors should then proceed to the next highest number completing the plot against own start.
FINISH DEPTH	When ploughing proceeds alternative bodies to be used at all times. To consist of last 19 or 20 furrows. Minimum depth of 20cm.

VINTAGE & CLASSIC PLOUGHING

GUIDELINES FOR COMPETITORS

1. Discs / skimmers / tailpieces are optional and can be of a different make.
2. Weights can be used on tractors or ploughs.
3. Adjustable stays on plough mouldboards are allowed.
4. Quick entry or slotted top links are allowed.
5. Extended wheel axles are allowed.
6. Screw adjustments on cross shafts are allowed.
7. Modified plough shares are allowed.
8. Only approved manufacturers diesel engine conversions allowed.
9. Hydraulic top links and other hydraulic rams are not allowed.
10. Stubble chains are not allowed.
11. a) **VINTAGE:** Two-piece adjustable tailpieces are not allowed.
b) **CLASSIC:** Two-piece adjustable tailpieces are allowed.
12. Drawbars with hydraulic movement not allowed.
13. Four wheel drive conversions not allowed.
14. A list of eligible tractors is available from the Society of Ploughmen on request.
15. The Society of Ploughmen rules will apply.

SOCIETY OF PLOUGHMAN VINTAGE & CLASSIC PLOUGHING RULES

1. TRACTOR

VINTAGE: In both trailing and mounted plough classes, all models of tractor must have been in production **before 31st December 1959.**

CLASSIC: In the classic and classic reversible class all models of tractor must have been in production **before 31st December 1976.** Therefore, some tractors with Q cabs will now be eligible.

2. PLOUGHS

a) **VINTAGE:** Trailing plough class -any trailing plough is eligible.

b) **VINTAGE:** Mounted plough classes-any mounted plough in production **before 31st Dec. 1959.**

CLASSIC: Any mounted plough in production **before 31st Dec. 1976,** but excluding Fiskars with KH & KHN bodies, Kvernlund Hydrien and Super Hydrien and Ransome/Bonning. YCN or Bonning bodies.

CLASSIC REVERSIBLE: Hydraulic turnover is not allowed

c) Any reversible plough with shear bolt or fixed leg in production **before 31st December 1976** but excluding Fiskars KH and KHN, Kvernlund Hydrien and Super Hydrien and Ransome/Bonning. YCN or Bonning bodies.

d) **VINTAGE:** Skimmers and one piece tailpieces optional - no other attachments allowed.

CLASSIC: Skimmers and tailpieces optional - no other attachments allowed.

- e) Plough bodies can be raised or lowered but cannot be raised out of the ploughing position.
- f) All plough bodies to be used when ploughing the finish.
- g) Extraneous attachments that manipulate the furrows or scratches are not allowed.

3. **TIME ALLOWED**

- a) 20 minutes for opening. **Penalty for failure to finish opening on time – 2 points per minute or part minute.**
- b) 30 minutes for openings to be judged
- c) **Penalty for failure to finish the plot at finishing signal – 10 points per minute or part minute.**
- d) 15 minutes extra time allowed for any cast-off made after commencement of ploughing.

4. **OPENING**

- a) Conventional: Double opening split - no land left unturned.

5. **START**

- a) Conventional: The start shall consist of 11 or 12 furrows.
- b) Competitors must cast towards the next highest numbered plot.

6. **FINISH**

- a) Conventional: The finish shall consist of the last 8 furrows.
- b) The last furrow to be cast towards competitor's own start.

7. **PLOUGHING**

Depth to be reached on completion of start and adhered to until commencing the finish.

- VINTAGE:** Depth of ploughing - 15cm minimum.
- CLASSIC:** Depth of ploughing - 17cm minimum.

8. **GENERAL**

- a) The first two runs next to the neighbouring competitor will not be judged, but ploughman must not mark their neighbour's ploughing with their tractor wheel. If there is a problem, the competitor must contact the head steward for a ruling before ploughing the first run next to their neighbour.
- b) Rolling of furrows and scratches is **not** allowed.
- c) Twin tractor wheels **not** allowed.
- d) Three siting poles **only** allowed (one can be placed on the headland) – assistance to set up and remove is allowed. No other assistance allowed including no assistance by signal, radio contact, mobile phone or any other method.
- e) Handling, shaping or treading of furrows or scratches is **not** allowed.
- f) Only one tractor wheel mark allowed at the finish.
- g) Only the Competitor is allowed to clean the plot of straw, stones etc.
- h) Competitors must produce evidence of age of tractor if requested.
- i) The use of GPS technology, laser beams or any other electronic or computerised devices are not allowed.
- J) Any abuse of, or dispute with, an official or fellow competitor by a competitor is not acceptable. **Penalty – 20 points.**

9. **SAFETY**

- a) Passengers are not allowed on tractors at any time.
- b) The Society's Safety Policy to be adhered to at all times.
- c) Instructions given by Stewards must be adhered to, **Penalty -disqualification.**

c) Horses must not be left unattended on the headland.
d) **Class 13** No boats, presses or any other attachment allowed
e) **Class 14** Boats, presses and any other attachment may be used at the competitor's discretion.
